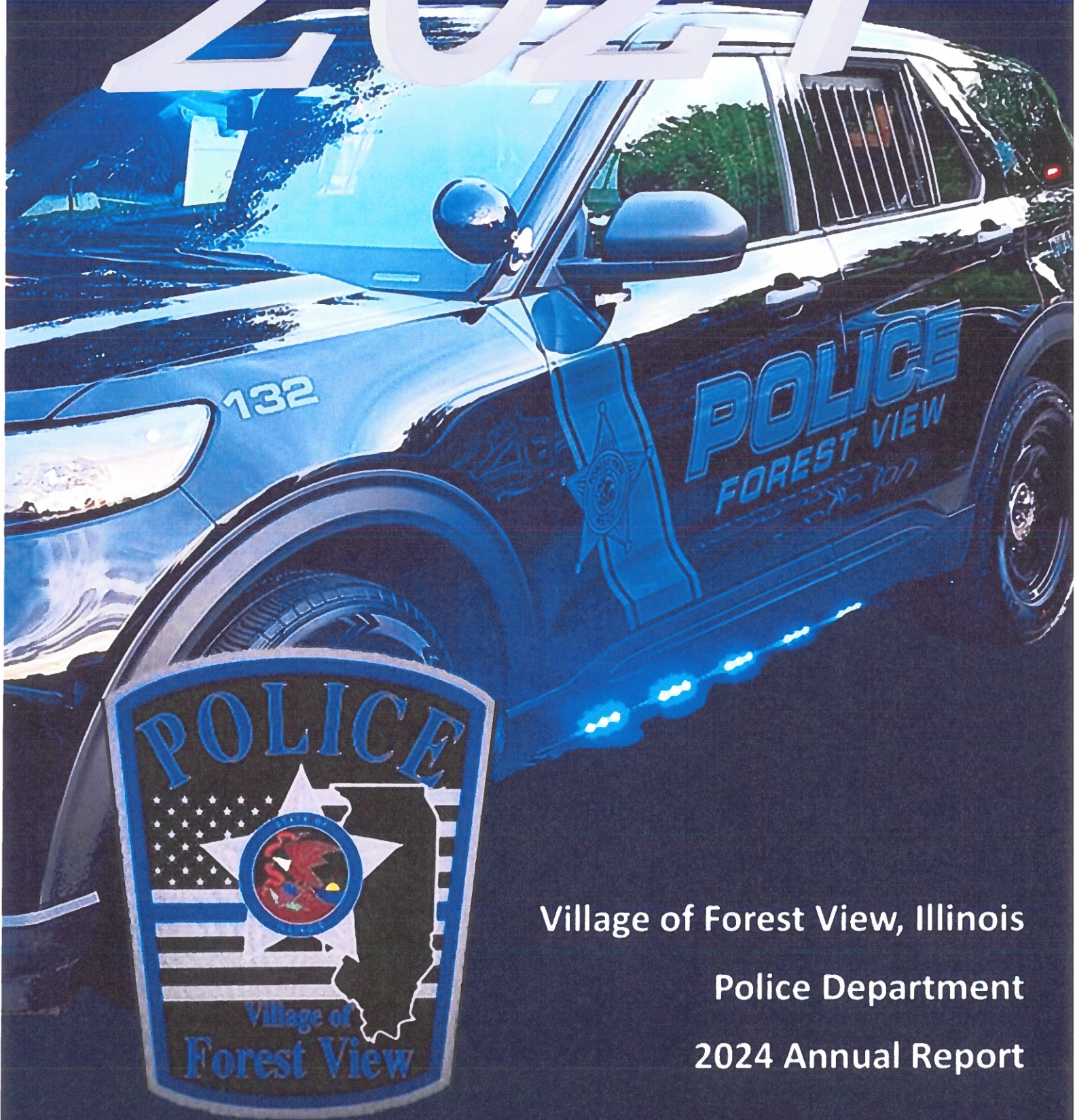

Chief's Message,

It's my pleasure as Police Chief to present the 2024 Forest View Annual Report. I personally want to thank the Village President, Village Board and Village Administrator for all the support they provide to the Forest View Police Department. In addition, I want to also thank the Fire Chief and Director of Public Works for their continued support.



In 2024, our department applied for and was awarded grant funds to increase our accountability to the community and improve our enforcement efforts. These grants were from the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB) Camera Grant award \$16,745 towards funding of five patrol squad cameras and the Illinois Attorney General's Office award of \$25,600 towards retail theft crime deterrence and enforcement.

Our police department has worked hard to move the police department into a Community Policing Model where all members of the department work with our trustees, residents and business owners in order to determine the biggest issues facing our community and developing an effective strategy to solve important issues. I personally encourage any resident or business owner to approach any of our officers or command staff and raise any areas of concern that might arise. We are here to protect and serve our entire Forest View community and Village. Our staff has been very active in community events across the year. Some of these activities are reflected within the pages of this report.

The personnel of this department are proud of the quality of service that is provided to the citizens and visitors to Forest View. This high level of service can only be delivered to the community through department members dedicating themselves to be prepared for whatever is asked. The work ethic displayed is something that I am very proud of. It doesn't matter how routine or how challenging the incident may be, it will be handled by personnel that are prepared.

I thank you for taking the time to look at our Annual Report. I also want to say thank you to the citizens of Forest View for the support shown to the department as it means a great deal to us.

The Cinderella Village



Centennial
1924 FOREST VIEW 2024

In 2024, the Village of Forest View celebrated our 100th Anniversary! There were several Centennial events held across 2024. The Village was officially incorporated Dec.8th, 1924. Inscribed in the original incorporation book are the words: "The Village of Forest View as founded and incorporated in memory to those who joined and participated in the Country's cause in the World's War of 1917 - 1918." It is the only known Village in the United States of America originally governed exclusively by ex-servicemen. The Village of Forest View was originally conceived by attorney Joseph Nosek as a haven for World War I veterans.



Founded in 1924, the village received its name for the view of the forest preserves and beautiful wooded and flowered prairies just west of the newly incorporated area across Harlem Avenue. In the mid-1920's Nosek and others were forced to leave town by gangster Ralph Capone, and Forest View soon earned the nickname "Caponeville." Newspaper accounts from the period refer to Forest View as a "mystery town" run by "phantom men" and detail how the mobster muscled his way into Forest View, driving out the veterans and their families. Capone housed bootleg liquor distilleries in local homes and garages and founded the Maple Inn, an infamous brothel on what is now the 4600 block of Maple. Encouraged by police, vigilantes burned down Capone's headquarters, and the gangster moved his operation north to Cicero. With Capone's departure, the village receded from view. After Capone's influence waned, the effects of the Great Depression prevented Forest View from developing. Growth came in 1949 when Commonwealth Edison built a huge generating plant between Oak Park and Ridgeland Avenues. Revenues from the plant gave the town a new lease on life, and the annexation of industrial land (part of the Clearing Industrial District) fueled further development after 1952. The village expanded from 50 homes to more than 250, and the proliferation of industry led some to refer to it as the trucking capital of the world. What was once Caponeville became the 'Cinderella Village' in the 1950s.



The Village is governed by a President and six Trustees. The Village Trustees are elected at large and serve for a term of four years, with three Trustees slated for election at two year intervals. The President is the chief executive officer and is elected to a four year term. The Village Clerk is the custodian of all official records for the Village and serves in an appointed position, created in 1997. The Village Administrator is also an appointed position.



The Village of Forest View has approximately 792 residents and encompasses 1.29 square miles. However, upwards of 70,000 people visit, work, or pass through the Village of Forest View every day. The residential section encompasses only about 10% of the area, while the other 90% is comprised of the Stevenson Expressway corridor, industrial areas along Harlem Avenue, and the trucking related facilities on 47th Street between Central and Laramie Avenues. The Village of Forest View has a robust industrial corridor along I-55, but with that comes challenges in providing quality services while sustaining affordable taxes, and making sure that everyone who lives, works, or passes through the village does so in a safe and effective manner.

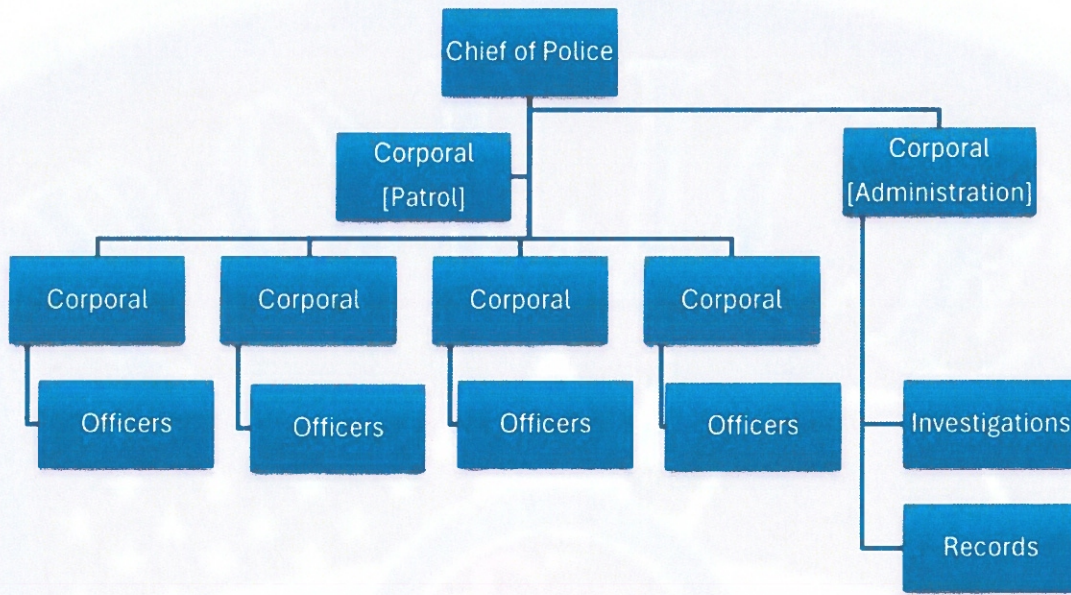
MISSION STATEMENT

The department also has 2 civilian records clerks.

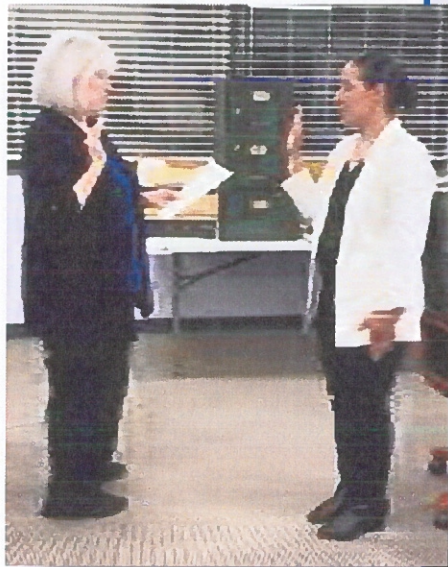
One Corporal supervises the patrol division and one Corporal supervises the administrative section.

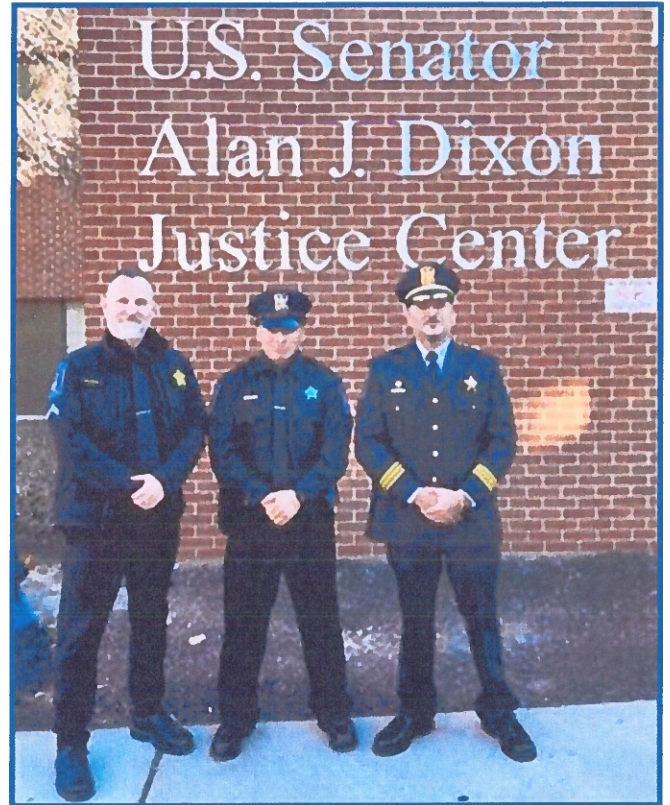

PATROL OPERATIONS

Patrol is one of the most visible functions of the department. Patrol officers are the ones the community sees responding to calls for service.

Our patrol division is divided into 2 groups, (A & B) with a day and night shift within each group. The patrol division works 12-hour shifts, 6am - 6pm or 6pm -6am. All shifts are staffed 24 hours a day seven days a week.

Each shift has one supervisor, either a Sergeant, Corporal or officer in charge. The supervisors are responsible for ensuring departmental goals are met, the supervision of on-duty personnel and enforcing laws and Village ordinances.

In 2024, the patrol division handled 7,717 calls for service. This was an increase of 8% from 2023. Total arrests made in 2024 was 112.

CRISIS INTERVENTION

10 officers have been certified as Crisis Intervention Team members (CIT).

CIT officers receive their training certification from the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board upon completing a 40-hour training course and then receive an 8-hour refresher class. The Forest View Police Department will be sending additional officers as they are hired. The CIT training gives officers tools needed to deal with members of the public experiencing a mental health crisis. These tools include verbal de-escalation techniques as well as other communication techniques tailored to specific mental illnesses. Using these techniques, CIT trained officers are able to create a positive outcome while reducing any use of force. Additional focus is also placed on getting the individual the necessary help while trying to keep them out of the criminal justice system when possible.

INVESTIGATIONS

The Investigations Unit consist of detectives who investigate some of our most demanding and challenging cases. Sometimes crimes can take months or even years to solve to successfully prosecute the offender(s). Detectives regularly provide testimony in court due to their specialized training and experience.

A successful investigation requires collaboration from local, regional, county, state and federal jurisdictions. To enhance this collaboration, detectives are assigned to task forces with the following specialized units:

Major Case Assistance Team - (MCAT)

Mobile Field Force - (MFF)

Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System - (ILEAS)

West Suburban Major Task Force - (WESTAF)



EVIDENCE TECHNICIANS

The Forest View Police Department has two officers trained as evidence technicians. An evidence technician is responsible for crime scene management, photography, sketching and diagramming. Other important responsibilities include identifying, handling, packaging and submitting evidence to state crime labs. In 2024, Evidence Technician Officer Guzman responded 17 times to assist with processing crime scenes as part of WESTAF (West Suburban Major Crime Task Force).

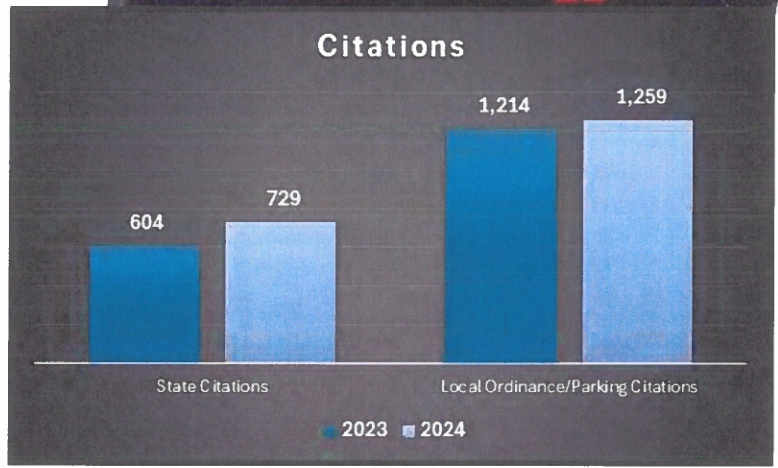


TRAFFIC

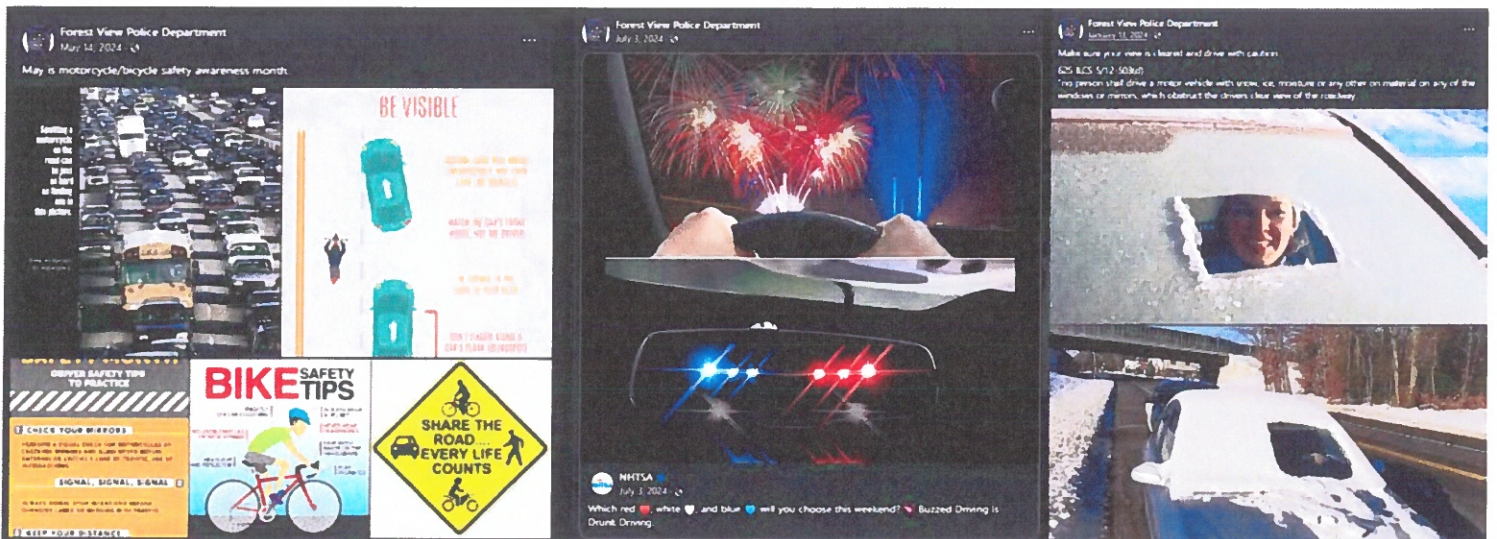
The Department facilitates the safe movement of motor vehicles and pedestrians through traffic control and enforcement, as well as education. Traffic enforcement promotes the safety of motorists and pedestrians.

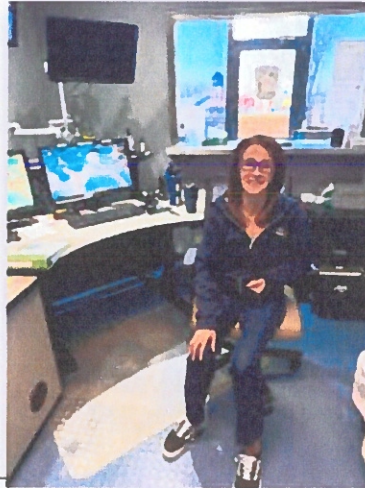
The primary objective of our department's traffic enforcement program is to promote traffic safety, increase voluntary adherence to traffic laws by the driving public, and reduce traffic crashes, especially those that result in personal injury. This includes traffic enforcement patrols by sworn officers and providing traffic safety information through our social media.

Truck enforcement is particularly challenging on our roadways. Truck Enforcement efforts in 2024 resulted in the issuance of 148 Truck Enforcement Violation citations.

RECORDS OPERATIONS

The Records Division of the Forest View Police Department is responsible for the management and coordination of police records, which include processing of Freedom of Information Requests for Police Department related materials.

Our Records Clerks responsibilities include answering all telephone calls which come to the Police Department on non-emergency phone lines, resolving complaints and inquiries when those responsible are not available, taking messages as required or directing calls to necessary staff voicemail, receiving people who come to the police department in person and who need to be referred to sworn police personnel, accepting payment for Village and State citations, completing all paperwork for administrative towed vehicles and accepts payments. The Clerks also process and enter all documents into the department files, including handling arrest warrant files.

The Records Clerks are also trained in and assists the department with a variety of other specialty duties including:

- Monitor multiple CCTV security camera systems.
- Performs matron duties on female prisoners or detainees, when required (female clerks only).
- Process and completes legal subpoenas.
- Responsible for sending out community wide mass notifications.

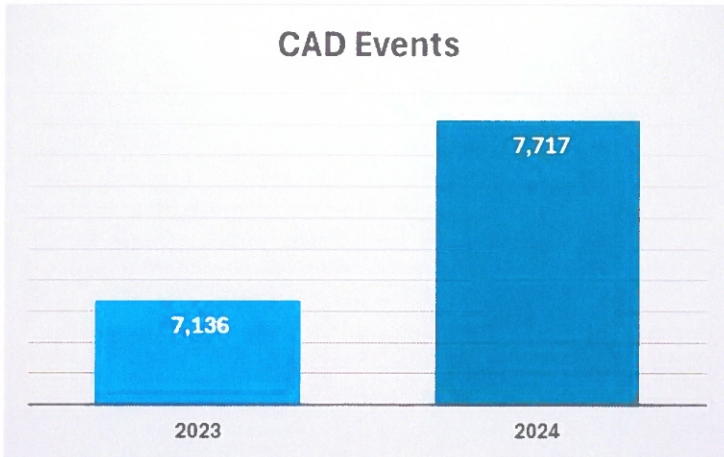
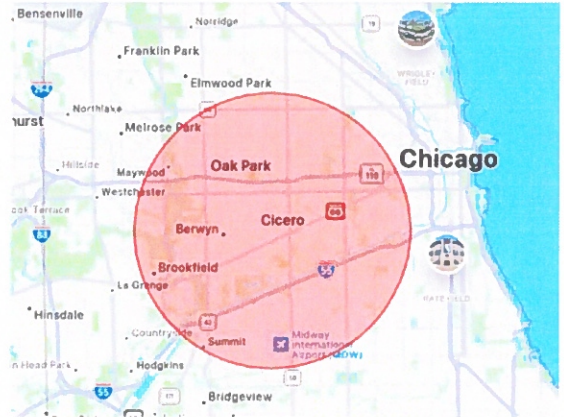
COMMUNICATIONS

The Forest View Police Department Honor Guard was established in 2023. When called upon, the Honor Guard team serves as a tribute to sworn personnel who have made the ultimate sacrifice. The team also pays tribute to deceased active and retired personnel. Tributes include; serving as pallbearers, rifle bearers, and presenting national, State, and Forest View colors.

The team also participates in parades, local and national police memorials. Members of the team are physically fit, possess impeccable uniform standards, are in good standing with the Department, have a willingness to perform close quarter drill and ceremony, and appreciate the meaning of Integrity, Service and Pride. Initially, team members receive two weeks of training, followed by monthly in-service training. The team wears Honor Guard uniforms, which distinguishes them as members of the team.

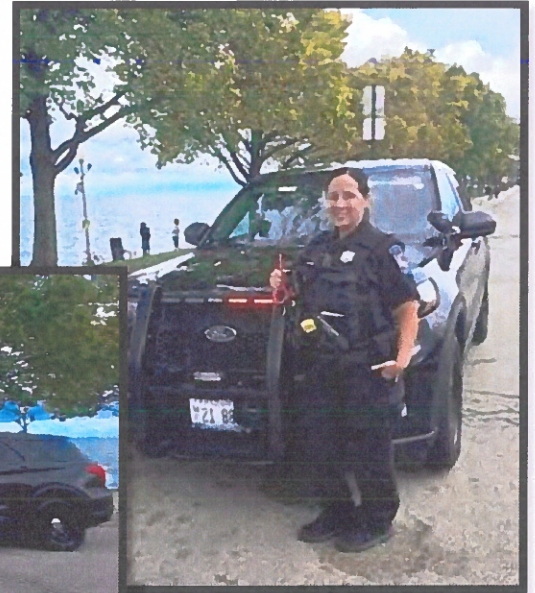
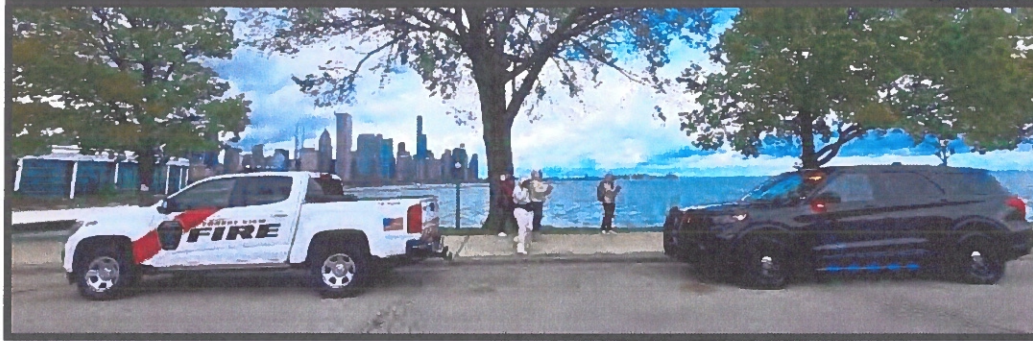

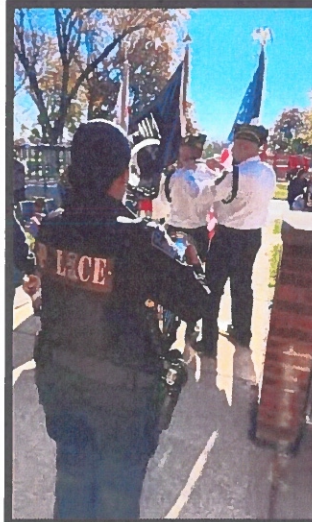
COLUMBUS DAY PARADE

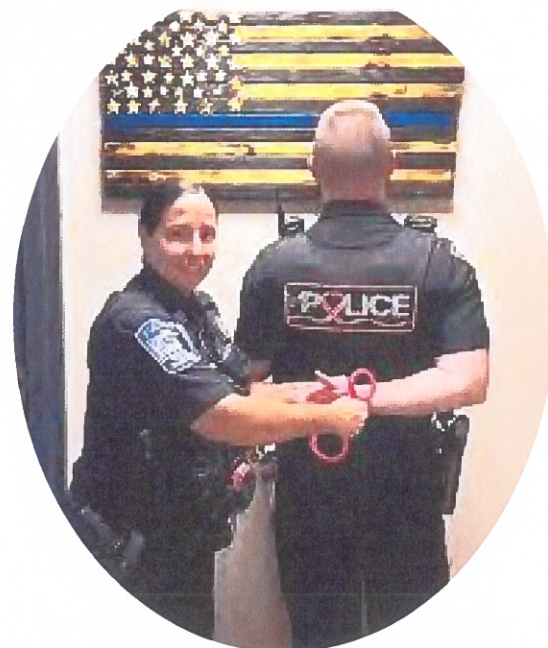




EQUIPMENT AND FLEET

In October, our officers proudly wore pink on their uniforms to show support and raise awareness for breast cancer.

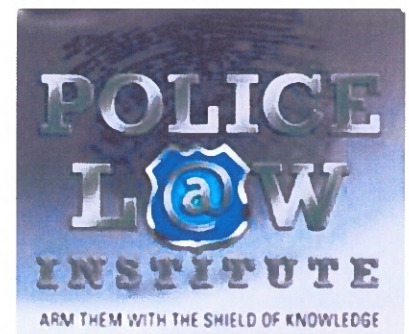


TRAINING

The Forest View Police Department's training mission is to develop and enhance the skills and knowledge of sworn and civilian employees. Sworn officers participate in firearm and rifle qualifications annually and attend class in person as well as on-line. In 2024, Forest View Police Department employees completed approximately 4000 hours of in-person and online training. Training classes were held at the Forest View Police Department, as well attended through North East Multi Regional Training (NEMRT), Tri-River Police Training and South West Illinois College Police Academy (SWIC). The officers and civilian staff also completed training online through Police Law Institute (PLI) and online Learning Network (PTB).
